Elder Kangar and his wife joined the Church of Christ (Holiness) U.S.A. in 1991 under the leadership of the late Elder Eddie Jones and served as his assistant before he was appointed to be the pastor of First Church of Christ (Holiness) U.S.A. in Starkville, MS. Elder Kangar has pastored several churches within COCHUSA.
